


Representation for Reimbursement





Licensing Board Updates: LARA

clarifying that an individual who by education, training, or experience <u>substantially meets</u> the requirements of Michigan state law for licensure (including being licensed in another U.S. state or being a recently retired Michigan practitioner) while rendering medical care in a time of disaster or to an ill or injured individual at the scene of an emergency is not required to obtain a Michigan license



Telepractice:

Gov.Whitmer's adminstration expanded telemedicine by allowing Medicaid beneficiaries to receive services in their home. Additionally, insurance plans announced they will cover and encourage virtual care and telemedicine, as well as waive cost sharing for COVID-19 testing.

Department of Health and Human Services Bulletin 20-09 allowing telemedicine services reimbursable on the current Medicaid fee schedule to be received in a client's home Department of Health and Human Services Bulletin 20-13: expanding telehealth services eligible for reimbursement to include OT services



- Working with stakeholders to allow state licensure reciprocity
- Could help with providing telehealth services, continuity of care, and monitoring disciplinary actions in multiple states
- Goal is set for 2024



- First Program: University of Michigan Flint
 - Admit: Fall 2019, 32 Students
 Capstone Experiences Spring 2022
- Grand Valley State University (Post Professional)

- Other OT programs currently working on curriculum mapping for transition timeline



- Level II Fieldwork: must be 24 weeks fulltime (OT), 16 weeks (OTA)
- Can be part-time as long as it is 50% of an FTE at that site
- Can be a minimum of one setting if reflective of more than one area of practice
- Maximum of 4 different practice settings (OT), 3 different practice settings (OTA)



OT

- 10 weeks/14 weeks
- 11 weeks/13 weeks
- 12 weeks/12 weeks

OTA

- 6 weeks/10 weeks
- 7 weeks/9 weeks
- 8 weeks/8 weeks



- Q: My students completed 9 weeks of Level II Fieldwork. The student was evaluated using the FWPE. However, in some instances the FWPE does not apply. How can we evaluate student performance.
- ACOTE® standard C.1.15 requires that the program "Document mechanisms for requiring formal evaluation of student performance on Level II fieldwork (e.g., the AOTA Fieldwork Performance Evaluation for the Occupational Therapy Student or equivalent." If the program decides the FWPE is not appropriate, the program must demonstrate that a documented formal evaluation of student performance on Level II fieldwork was completed.

ACOTE: COVID-19

Level II Fieldwork:

- Telehealth MEETS the requirement for Level II fieldwork
- Simulation and case studies provided online do <u>NOT MEET</u> the requirements for Level II fieldwork



- Q: Are there alternatives for completing Level II fieldwork requirements, such as video-based visits and assignments?
- Faculty must determine if the strategy(ies) being used by their program meet the accreditation requirements for successful completion of Level II fieldwork. Each case is unique.



- C.1.3: Demonstrate Document that academic and fieldwork educators collaborate agree on established fieldwork objectives prior to the start of the fieldwork experience and communicate with the student and fieldwork educator about progress and performance throughout the during fieldwork experience.
- Ensure that fieldwork objectives for all experiences include a psychosocial objective

Changes: ACOTE Standards

⊘ C.1.9.:

Level I fieldwork may be met through one or more of the following instructional methods:

- Simulated environments
- Standardized patients
- Faculty practice
- Faculty-led site visits
- Supervision by a fieldwork educator in a practice environment

• C.1.11: Level II Fieldwork

Ensure Document and verify that the student is supervised by a currently licensed or otherwise regulated occupational therapist/assistant who has a minimum of one year full-time practice experience as a licensed or otherwise regulated OT/OTA, prior to the onset of the Level II fieldwork.

Ensure that the student supervisor is adequately prepared to serve as fieldwork educator <u>prior to</u> the Level II fieldwork.





> Prolonged and Increased Student Debt



- Therapists with years of experience are losing jobs
- Therapists are being asked to take furlough days
- Caseloads are significantly reduced
- We had to close our doors
- PPE is too expensive/not available for students



Symptom Based Strategy

- 72 hours since recovery of fever without fever reducing medication and improvement of respiratory symptoms
- At least 10 days since symptoms first appeared

Test Based Strategy

- Following a positive COVID-19 test
- recovery of fever without fever reducing medication and improvement of respiratory symptoms
- Negative results of an FDA
 Emergency Use Authorized COVID19 molecular assay for detection
 of SARS-CoV-2 RNA from at least
 two consecutive respiratory
 specimens collected ≥24 hours
 apart (total of two negative
 specimens)




MOTEC 2021 - Level II Fieldwork Reservation Request Process

 - Please give all academic programs equitable consideration
 - Please consider Michigan academic programs requests before out-of-state academic requests
