<u>Promoting Evidence-Based</u> Practice with Partnerships

Evidence-based practice (EBP) has become an expectation of occupational therapy practitioners, yet barriers prevent therapists from effectively incorporating EBP principles into their daily practice. An article written by Zapletal, Vesy, and Johnson (2018) suggests an effective strategy that could be used to bridge the gap between research and clinical practice. By collaborating with academic institutions, through Level II Fieldwork affiliations, fieldwork educators reported changes in attitudes towards EBP as well as changes in their practice with incorporation of new information, techniques, and treatment. ## **Advocacy Updates**



On February 21, 2019, MiOTA held its annual Lansing Lobby Day of advocacy for OTs, OTAs, and students around the state of Michigan. Our turnout this year was incredible: over 170 OTs, OTAs, and students attended! Many Occupational Therapy education programs around the state were well represented with students and professors coming from all areas of the state. With recent election changes, our professional advocates had to opportunity to educate over 40 new legislative members on what OT is and what OT does.

MiOTA held a training session in the morning with MiOTA lobbyist, John Smalley and MiOTA Lobby Day committee members Michael O'Connor, Steven Eberth, and Advocacy Director Jeannie Kunz. The OT advocates held with many meetings and conversations with Michigan Senators and House Representatives to discuss Auto No-Fault

insurance reforms. With ongoing debates and pending legislative changes to Michigan's Auto No-Fault laws, our message was well-timed! MiOTA's 170-strong advocated for clients and patients to our legislators. We reviewed opposition to torte-only insurance programming and to fee-scheduling which may limit access to Occupational Therapy services. We support Michigan's cost-reduction strategies as well as preserving motor vehicle accident survivors' access to funding for sufficient medical and rehabilitative benefits and retaining some form of lifetime injury coverage for residents.

MiOTA is proud to have had a strong voice in Lansing to advocate for reasonable Auto No-Fault insurance reform while maintaining access to care and benefits for our clients in our great state!

Since Lansing Lobby day, there have been follow up meetings scheduled with OT constituents and MiOTA's advocacy team with interested legislators. This is an exciting step toward action and a perfect demonstration of how our united voice can be powerful to lawmakers. Partnering with your state legislators is a key aspect to continued high-quality occupational therapy services.

In addition to MiOTA's advocacy efforts on Auto No-Fault insurance reform, the Advocacy Committee is following nationwide legislative trends regarding Health Care reform and a multitude of

Medicaid-related changes. Statewide areas to monitor include insurance caps and ABA therapy, co-pay legislation, and pain management initiatives and opportunities. Areas to be monitored and supported are School-Based Occupational Therapy Service Delivery and Mental Health Supports. We are watching regulatory issues that concern scope of practice challenges by other professions and accepting new treatment techniques within our scope of practice. We are reviewing and discussing upcoming legislative issues within the state, including interstate licensures and occupational licensing concerns.

Thank you for your continued support of MiOTA so we can advocacy and support our profession today and tomorrow. Keep Calm and Lobby On!

#### MiOTA is looking for a few individuals to run for office this year.

Communication Director: This position appoints, (with the approval of the Executive Committee) and oversees the Coordinators of the Newsletter, Website and Listserv coordinator as well as Networking Committees and the subsections of the Networking Committee (Special Interest Sections [SIS] and Chapters). They discharge the duties of the Leader of the Executive Committee in the absence of the Leader; perform other such duties as are assigned by the Executive Committee, and orient incoming elected director at least two (2) months prior to the first day of the fiscal year before the elected member assumes office.

**Financial Director**: This position is responsible for managing the fiscal affairs of the Corporation so that the financial resources are available to allow the Corporation to achieve its goals. They prepare the budget and present it to the Executive Committee for approval. Act in an advisory capacity to the Agent of the Corporation. Keep full and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements of the Corporation or delegate to an Agent for the Corporation as specified within a contract. Arrange for the annual review of the corporation accounts by a qualified accountant.

Submit written statements of financial affairs to the Executive Committee for all Executive Committee meetings and at other intervals as it determines. Review submitted Co-Sponsoring Activity with MiOTA Worksheets and Cost Projections Worksheets with other interested parties and informs the person or persons of acceptance, need for revision, or denial of the proposal. Orient incoming elected director at least two (2) months prior to the first day of the fiscal year before the elected member assumes office. Perform other such duties as are assigned by the Executive Committee. If any member has interest in any of these positions, please contact the MiOTA office. To be eligible, nominees must be members of both MiOTA and AOTA registered within the state of Michigan to practice and have served on at least one committee of the corporation. A waiver of these qualifications may be granted by a majority vote of the Executive Committee. More information can be shared. Individuals may want to communicate with current officers for more in-depth discussion about the positions to assist in making a decision to be nominated for the offices. Deadline is June 15, 2019. If interested, please contact MiOTA Office.

#### Michigan Special Education Advisory Committee

MiOTA has been a organizational representative on Michigan's Special Education Advisory Committee since September 2018. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) mandates each state have an advisory panel to provide input to the State Board of Education and the Michigan Department of Education. The Committee is made up of 33 individuals (administrators, providers, advocates, and consumers) concerned with the education of all children, including students with disabilities. The committee meets monthly during the school year. The mission of the SEAC is to support opportunities for all students in Michigan and especially those with disabilities by gathering, sharing, and disseminating information with the public; advising the State Board of Education; and working with the Office of Special Education.

The three priorities for the 2018/19 year include:

- 1. Understand and support the Michigan Department of Education's work in it's long-term process of state systemic improvement in support of the Top 10 in 10 priorities.
- 2. Mandatory professional learning for both incoming special and general educators as well as current educators, to build their capacity to effectively serve students with IEPs in the least restrictive environment.
- 3. Michigan's Read by Grade Three Law: The Read by Grade Three law includes challenges and implications for students reading below grade level and for special education programs and services.
